As the alien grey squirrel continues to spread across the lowlands of Scotland, the Borders and up the river valleys leading into Edinburgh, Glasgow, Dundee and Aberdeen, our native red squirrel is becoming more and more scarce in these areas. It is beginning to seem possible that red squirrels might one day be completely replaced by grey squirrels in Scotland. If we want to stop this from happening, we need to know where the best places for red squirrels are so that we can protect them. We also need to know the places where grey squirrels are entrenched and expanding their range.

You can help

by sending in records of where you have seen red and grey squirrels. It is especially important to notify us if grey squirrels turn up where they have not been seen before, but all records are useful.
